



PLM Standardisation: Milan Workshop

Location: Nearchimica, Legnano Italy

Date: 27-28 September 2011

The PLM Interest Group will run a 2-day PLM Standardisation Workshop in September 2011 in association with CL2M and Holonix, the driving force behind the QLM standard. The Workshop will be hosted by a PLM user company, Nearchimica, in Legnano, Italy. The event will enable participants to work collectively on the PLM best practices that have been generated in Italy and beyond.

What are the Objectives of the Workshop?

To bring together PLM practitioners and enable them to combine their experience to cover:-

- PLM Standards for SMBs
- Metrics for the operational benefits of implementing PLM
- Future closed-loop and through-life technology
- The current state of PLM Best Practice in Italy

What Issues will be Covered?

The Agenda is based on the PLMIG body of knowledge. It includes the results of the Gothenburg event in May 2011, which produced a standards framework to link the board with the PLM Team; and the Munich event in June 2011 which led to the recently-published 'Path to PLM'. The Milan workshop will also have a special feature on the role of QLM and advanced technology in improving the scope and accuracy of PLM.

You can use the group discussions at the Workshop to provide breakthrough ideas for the issues that are affecting your own implementation. After the Workshop, the PLMIG produces and publishes the working results. Participants will receive continual feedback from other events as the workshop series proceeds.
